Dear Parents,

As we prepare for a further lockdown period due to the alarming rise in the number of COVID cases, can I take this opportunity to remind parents of their responsibilities whilst coming onto the school site.

- We have staggered the drop off and pick up times to ensure everyone can enter and leave the site as safely as our environment permits. Please help by arriving promptly at the allocated time.
- There are yellow marking on the playground for a reason- parents should not be crossing over these unless asked to by a member of staff.
- Social Distancing: Please leave 2 metres between each other and ensure you follow social distancing guidelines at all times and avoid gathering. Give members of staff the appropriate space when talking to them.
- Please follow the one way system on the school site. The only entry point will be the main entrance at the front of the school.
- Entrances near the Reception class and the Year 1 door do get congested. Please stand back and away from these areas to allow parents who have collected their children to pass through quickly and safely.
- Please can parents try to avoid arriving on the school site too early. This creates congestion and reduces the effectiveness of the staggered start and finish times.
- Only one parent to bring pupils to school. Teachers and teaching assistants will meet the pupils at the door in order to hand sanitise them.
- Please do not loiter talking to other parents in the school playground after dropping off your child.
- Only urgent messages should be passed onto staff at drop off. Please ring or e-mail us at info@beever.oldham.sch.uk with anything non-urgent.
- In addition to this, in line with existing policies can I remind parents that dogs should not be brought onto the school site.

Members of staff are working tremendously hard in school to ensure that the children's educational provision is as good as it can possibly be. There are times when we are short staffed due to members of staff self isolating, but regardless of this, we will continue to try to ensure there is as little disruption for your child as possible.
