


Early Years- Homework

<p><u>Writing & Reading</u> Draw a picture about the stories you have read. Draw a picture of a treasure island and label it. Draw and talk about a character from a book-pirate, mermaid, sea monster, shark. Label a drawing of a pirate ship.</p>	<p><u>Communication & Language</u> Listen carefully and retell the stories from the book list. Discuss the stories in full sentences and answer questions about the stories. Listen to and follow instructions in the pirate game. Tell an adult how you made... a pirate ship, a den, things to dress up with or how you made up a game.</p>	<p><u>Mathematics</u> Count out a small number of stones, shells, coins etc.- how many have you got? Notice numbers in your house- what are they? Write some numbers up to 10. Count up to 10/20 out loud. Share out some treasure between two people. Add up how much treasure you can throw into the treasure chest. What is your highest score?</p>

Ask a grown up to help you make a den/junk model. Play the pirate games with your family/ a few friends outside, taking turns. How would you feel if you were sailing on a pirate ship/swimming underwater with sea creatures? Why?</p>
<p><u>Physical</u> Play the pirate game-see instructions below. Throw treasure (rolled up paper, balls, bean bags) into the treasure chest (box) How many can you get in? Make stepping stones/a plank to balance on. Can you move in different directions- forwards, sideways? Help make some healthy food to eat on your treasure island/den. Dance to your favourite music.</p>	<p><u>Expressive Arts and Design</u> Can you make a den inside or outside using a blanket and chairs? How can you fix the blanket on? Make a pirate telescope, a flag or a shark/sea monster out of paper and junk modelling. Pretend you're a pirate or a mermaid- what could you use to dress up? Sing- 'Row Row Your Boat', 'Big Ship Sails', 'Baby Shark', 'Under The Sea' (Disney's Little Mermaid) 'A sailor went to sea, sea, sea', and 'Animals in the Ocean'. (Use You Tube or the link below) Make up some music/a rhythm using pots and pans.</p>	<p><u>Understanding of the world</u> Look on the internet and find out about different sharks/sea creatures. Which is your favourite? Draw and write about what the sea creatures look like, what they eat etc. Build a den and take a photo of it. Splash in some water in the garden or in the bath. Add some bubbles. Paint with water outside- what happens?</p>

Instructions For The Pirate Game

<u>Command</u>	<u>Action</u>
Main deck	Children line up in front of the Captain
Scrub the decks	Children crouch down and pretend to clean the floor with their hands
Captain's coming	Children salute and shout 'Aye aye captain'
Peg leg Jim	Children must hop on one leg
Man overboard	Children lie on their backs waving their arms and legs in the air as if they've fallen into the sea!
Climb the ladder	Pretend to climb up a ladder
Walk the plank	Walk in a straight line one foot in front of the other, arms outstretched to the sides
Hit the deck	Lie down on stomach as quickly as possible
Sharks!	Sit on floor hugging knees whilst feet are up
